Vail Village Property Owner,

The Vail Town Council will be reviewing the topic of loading and delivery at its regular meeting on Tuesday, July 7, beginning at 6 p.m. in the Vail Town Council Chambers, 75 S. Frontage Rd.

This discussion will include review of a possible option to add an 8-foot wide parking pullout on the south side of Gore Creek Drive next to the Mill Creek Court Building. This pullout would relocate the adjacent designated loading zone which allows for 30-minute permit parking for vehicles no larger than 20 feet long from 6 a.m. to 6 p.m. Converting the current landscaped area to a loading and delivery parking area would provide a safer way to accommodate the movement of goods, as well as maintain the flow of vehicles and pedestrians through the area. This improvement would take place entirely on town property at the town's expense.

The purpose of the July 7 discussion is to present an overview of this option and to solicit feedback from those who would be impacted. The Town Council could then determine if the option should be explored in additional detail, including design and cost estimates, and a timetable for construction. A site visit to this location is also scheduled on July 7 and will be taking place during the Town Council's afternoon work session.

Conceptual plans of the pullout are enclosed.
